

**RESOLUTION ADOPTING
GUILFORD COUNTY
HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN**

WHEREAS, the North Carolina General Assembly passed Senate Bill 300 "An Act to Amend the Laws Regarding Emergency Management as Recommended by the Legislative Disaster Response Commission" in June of 2001 that among other provisions requires local governments to have a hazard mitigation plan approved prior to August, 2002 in order to receive state public assistance funds; and

WHEREAS, in October of 2000 the President of the United States signed into law the "Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000" (PL 106-390) to amend the "Robert T. Stafford Relief and Emergency Act of 1988" which among other provisions requires local governments to adopt a mitigation plan in order to be eligible for hazard mitigation funding; and

WHEREAS, the North Carolina Division of Emergency Management has established rules and criteria that allow municipalities to adopt their county's approved mitigation plan through resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Summerfield has worked closely with the Greensboro-Guilford County Emergency Management to develop a county-wide hazard mitigation plan that will serve the needs of Summerfield citizens; and


WHEREAS, the Town of Summerfield supports Hazard Mitigation Planning as a logical means toward protecting people and property from the potential devastating effects of natural hazards:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Summerfield Town Council,

1. Assign representation as determined by Council to work with Core Team Mitigation Committee.
2. Adopt, by way of this resolution, the "Guilford County Mitigation Plan" as approved by the North Carolina Division of Emergency Management.
